


1. From the Club Profile Click on Member Roster

2. Navigate to the page that contains the member's name.
3. On the row which contains the member's name, click on View. This will cause the member's scoring record to be displayed.
4. Click on the Score for the round that you wish to edit and the Posting screen will load with the information for you to edit or delete. You may edit any of the information displayed or click on Delete This Score to remove the score entirely.
5. Click on Post Score when done editing and the change will be loaded into the Member's scoring record. That score will then be displayed in Red, indicating that it has been edited.
